Speaker: Kirk Chapman - The Humanity Project

When he walked into our club on Friday morning last week, you could tell there was something different about this man. Kirk Chapman, a native of Alaska, moved to Greenville in 1999 as an IT professional. In his search for meaning, he wanted to give more than a technical service. He found a small orphanage in India that he thought needed some financial support. He gave, and gave quite generously. Curious about how his money was being used, he decided to visit India and the Orphanage. Now the rest of the story.

The orphanage was started in 2003 by a former Indian Army Colonel (a Christian man) that wanted to make a difference for some children located in the Cashmere region of India. The region, primarily Muslim and Hindu had a high percentage of unloved and uncared for orphans. One story in particular, two young children were found beside their mother's body, which had been dead for four days. No one helped them. Many of the children had been abused sexually and physically. Most spoke nomadic tribal languages and had to be taught to communicate in a common language.

Kurt has since become more than a financial donor. Although he gives \$9,000 per year of his personal funds to support a single teacher for a year, he also makes trips back to the orphanage. He is planning a trip in the summer to take some of these children on a trip back into their native country ... to visit relatives ... to get closure on a bad part of their childhood. Included is a mountain climb to help these children build trust in one another. YOU CAN GIVE TO THIS. Kirk is trying to raise \$12 K for expenses. See Richard for details.
